# **Molasses Cookie Recipe**

Cam Miller received several requests for the molasses cookie recipe from her mother, Dona Cheney. Here it is:

### Mix:

1 cup Crisco 1 1/2 cups sugar 1 cup Brer Rabbit dark molasses 2 eggs Combine then mix in: 1/2 cup cold water 3 tsp soda dissolved in 2 tbsp vinegar

Mix 2 tsp ginger, 1 tsp cloves and 1/2 tsp salt into 5 cups flour and add to previous ingredients.
Chill dough one hour. Roll out about 1/2 inch thick. Cut out and place 6 on cookie sheet. Will spread. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Makes 30 soft cookies.
Do not overbake. Enjoy!
