Receiving God's Blessings

Communion is a gift to the church in all times and places. The Spirit blesses us wherever we are. So those at home are welcome to prepare bread and drink to commune with us and Christians everywhere.

Invitation to the Meal

One: Friends, we know what it feels like to look for God.

We know what it feels like to turn our heads up to the sky, looking for stars or signs. We know what it feels like to walk day after day, hoping that we grow closer to God. We know what it feels like to seek. I think that's part of why we end up here, because we are hoping that in the midst of this messy world we might catch a glimpse of God that will carry us through.

Well friends, I have good news. God is already here. Like a Mighty wind, God is moving through this room. God is at this Table, inviting us forward. The invitation may not be as clear as a star in the sky, but from generation to generation, God has always gathered with God's people. So come to this Table with your questions and your doubts. Come with your joys and your gratitude. Come seeking, come hungry, come curious. Come open. Come not because you have to, but because you can. Come with all of you, for there is room for you here.

Many: This is God's Table; this is God's meal. We are the guests.

One: And so with an attitude of prayer in our hearts, we pray...

Many: God of today, tomorrow and yesterday,

Like the Magi, we are seeking you.

Like the Magi, we are bringing ourselves closer to you, step by step, and word by word. So today we ask that you would make yourself known to us. Reach into our spirits and give us a boost of confidence that love is real and we are not alone. Speak to us in this bread. Speak to us in the cup.

Holy God, it is with grateful hearts that we pray together the words your son taught us to pray, saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

Sharing of the Elements

One: With Christians around the world and throughout the centuries, we gather around these symbols of bread and juice—simple elements that speak of nourishment and transformation. In this meal we remember Jesus, The words he spoke and the life he lived.

We remember his invitation for us to be transformed from the inside—out. We remember on the night when Jesus and the disciples shared their last meal, Jesus took the bread, gave thanks, broke it and said,

"Take and eat; whenever you do this, remember me."

(The bread is distributed. The cup in the center is gluten free. Please hold the bread so that all may eat together).

One: Let us share the bread of life.

(You may eat the bread.)

One: After their meal,

Jesus took the cup, and poured it, saying, "This is the new covenant, remember me."

(The cup is distributed. Please drink the cup as you are served.)


