#### Greetings, beloved ones!

Every year we enter Lent as on a journey that begins with Jesus' own sojourn in the wilderness. Neither the journey nor the wilderness comes naturally anymore to Americans, who long ago completed their journey and tamed their wilderness. To be sure, we are a highly mobile people, but truth be told—we don't seem to be going anyplace special. We move from town to town, job to job and marriage to marriage, but the telos of our wanderings and the satisfaction of our longings often remain elusive.



Each week in the Lenten Gospel readings, we will explore what it might mean to live a life which is "Leaning Towards the Light" as the church makes its progress by means of a series of dialogues--on temptation (with the devil), on perplexity (Nicodemus), on longing for what is real (the Samaritan woman), and on the true identity of Jesus (the man formerly blind). We will conclude with a couple of conversations about death and resurrection held in Jewish cemeteries. Along the way, we will discover that the journey does not follow the familiar route from a lower-paying to a higher-paying job, from illness to health, or from

misery to happiness. The Temptation, where we started the final Sunday of February, re-narrated Israel's experience as a pattern of the church's struggle in an alien environment called the wilderness.

Flannery O'Connor has a story about a little girl who loves to visit the convent and the sisters. But every time the nun gives her a hug, the crucifix on Sister's belt gets mashed into the child's face. The gesture of love always leaves a mark.

On our journey toward the resurrection, we discover our true identity or, better, it is imprinted upon us. For some it is a fearful experience of testing, but one that is moderated by a special grace; we make this journey together, with the whole Christian church on earth, and we follow the One who has already completed the course.

Our church held our annual meeting on January 29th. The congregation approved the annual reports as printed and also accepted The First Congregational Pilgrim Charitable Trust report. The proposed budget of \$294,794.00 was approved and the nominees for departments and church officers were elected. Again, a big Thank You to the folks who agreed to serve.

The February board meeting was postponed due to the snow storm on the 21st, so we have no update of what was accomplished. One item to be discussed is the requirement in the church constitution for all congregational votes be done in person. There are some who would like to be able to attend annual meetings and vote on Zoom or some other way on line. There was also the

mention of voting by mail. I anticipate that a task force will be appointed to investigate the different possibilities available that will ensure the confidentiality and the identity of the votes. There are many who believe that church is an in-person experience and would prefer to leave the constitution as is. It will undoubtedly be an interesting discussion. As we make our way through Lent toward Palm Sunday and finally to the celebration of Easter, let us remember and pray for those less fortunate in the world - the innocent folks in Ukraine or those who lost family and all possessions in Turkey - and also those in our country, state and town who suffer. We need to let them know "that no matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you

Eighty-seven (87) votes were "Yes" (97.7%) and two (2) votes were "No" (2.3%). A formal invitation will be extended to Erin at the next Pastoral Relations Meeting. If she accepts the invitation, she will begin her duties as Designated Term Pastor on April 1, 2023.
