October happens to be one of my most favorite months of the year—perhaps because Autumn is usually in the air (unless something like storm Atlas hits, that is). For me this means cozy sweaters and warm socks, yummy smelling candles, hot pumpkin (or spiced chai) flavored drinks and of course the leaves performing their annual magic trick ritual of transforming from shades of green to vivid oranges, yellows and reds... and then releasing from their respective trees. Perhaps my affinity for October is also linked to it being my birthday month, it's hard to tell with so much to enjoy!

Autumn is a perfect time to release leaves and shake down those dead branches. Here are a couple things to begin to let go of to bring forth all the growth just waiting to happen.

Let go of control.

Control is one of the biggest myths of the modern age. It's tempting to believe that if we do a, b, and c, the outcome will be x, y, and z. But the only thing that is truly under your control is you.

Let go of guilt and regrets.

Guilt does serve a purpose - to keep us from repeating the mistakes of the past. The most powerful way to move on from guilt is to take these lessons to heart. Otherwise, guilt won't actually serve you, and can completely take over your life.

Let go of caring what other people think of you.

Others' thoughts about you are not truths. You are completely in control of the narrative of your own life and personality. You are uniquely you, and fitting in just might not be your destiny! There will be people who dislike you and misinterpret you - let them! What someone else thinks about you is none of your business. Instead of focusing on changing their opinion, just be authentically yourself.

BOARDS AND DEPARTMENTS

Moderator's Moment

Thanks to our department leaders and our wonderful office staff, the work of the church continues. Susan Kelts, Assistant Moderator is fulfilling the Moderator's duties while he takes time to visit family in Australia. The Church Board met on September 19 and the following items were discussed:

- A. The Department of Buildings and Grounds has been dealing with air conditioning, water softener and water pressure issues.
- B. Financials are stable and within budgeted parameters.
- C. We had a very successful Fall Kickoff for Christian Education and the department is working to create a "Teens and Tweens" group to meet weekly.
- Hospitality is planning more potluck events for our congregation.
- E. The sale of Church Response cards will be discontinued at the end of the year. There may be a special offering in February to support Church Response.
- F. Pastor Erickson will be hosting an interfaith roundtable to discuss support for the Hope Center. In addition, she will have her review with the Committee on Ministry on October 8. The Church Board will provide a letter of support to the COM with a request that she be considered for examination of ordination.
- G. Lighting for the sanctuary was discussed.
- H. Our custodian, Sydney, has resigned effective Oct. 1 Mary Haan will try the job for the month of October to see if it will work with her schedule.
- Pat Lebrun will be working with a committee to update and refurbish parts of the church. This will be funded by the Gene Lebrun memorial monies.
- J. The carpets in the building need to be cleaned. The cost for this will be investigated.
- K. A committee was formed to set up a more formal system for visitation of our church members.

Department of Stewardship and Budget

The financial condition of the church is sound at this time. Now that we have our desired staff on board, it will be important for all of us to continue being dedicated to our pledged giving goals. We have had the luxury of having some latitude in our budget the last couple years, but now that all of our line items have expenses being paid from them, we have less room for error and will continue to count on the unfailing generosity of our congregation.
