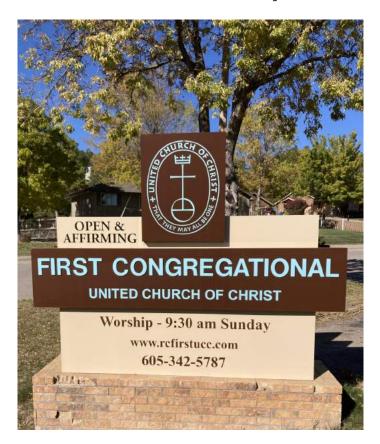

We all thought that everything would be back to normal or at least a "new" normal by this time. But we still do not have a settled senior pastor. Covid is still with us and raising its ugly head again as I write this. Our attendance on Sunday is still short of what it was before Covid. We hope and pray that those problems get at least partially solved in 2023. Your church board and those on all of the departments have been working diligently to make that happen.

The Department of Building and Grounds monitored the installation of the new boilers and took care of our landscaping while trying to keep watering costs down. They kept their eye on our building and fixed a myriad of small problems so they would not become big problems.

The Department of Stewardship and Budget watched our expenses and income to make sure we stayed within the approved budget for the year.

The Department of Ministries continued the selling of grocery cards and collecting food for Church Response and serving a meal at Cornerstone Mission on the 5th Friday of any month.

The Department of Hospitality organized several special social gatherings during our coffee hour after Sunday services.

The Department of Worship has continued their work of helping plan and organize worship and special music.

The Department of Education has been working to get Sunday school and all of the other young people programs back up and running and the number of children has been much better. The department has also organized the various adult education opportunities that happen after church services and during the week.

The Pastoral Search Committee, under the guidance of chairwoman Eileen Rossow, has spent a long and frustrating two and a half years searching for a settled pastor. We are hoping to have news on that front in the not too distant future. The members of that committee have gone above and beyond during the search process.

I would like to thank all of the board, department and committee members for making the hard decisions and attending the meetings that are necessary for our church to function.

I would also like to thank those who have volunteered to serve in the coming year. That is how we continue to be the church.

CARE MINISTER—Becky Fleming

Caring for others and making sure people have church visitors remains a focus for me with this faith group. There are times that this is more challenging as I worry that the contact I have with many of the surrounding communities due to my full time job which increases my risk for carrying COVID, Influenza, or RSV to our beloved congregants. However, I continue to err on the side of caution in both roles, usually masking unless people cannot hear me through a mask, and do not visit if I have any symptoms of illness. I greatly appreciate the Women's Fellowship leadership with ensuring additional visits and contact occur for those who need it. Pastor Erin has been extremely helpful with seeing our congregants as well. I have had communion with a variety of people in different settings over this past year. I have mailed more cards and made more phone calls than ever, trying to remain connected and supportive without putting anyone at risk for illness.

I continue to sit on the Committee on Ministry for South Dakota. This is helping me grow in providing pastoral care for those who are struggling. This group continues to attempt to meet the needs of congregations throughout our state, even through this COVID adventure. It has given me better understanding of how the conference works and has also allowed me to stand up and make sure that the conference understands how difficult it is to be a church seeking leadership at this time and place.

I was able to assist with several celebrations of life this past year. It is such a gift to be able to help others remember someone with love through their grief. I continue to enjoy leading worship and did so occasionally in this past year.

The biggest area of challenge for me remains simply not knowing when someone needs a call. There are those in our midst who do not want calls at the hospital and those in our midst who need those calls. I am hoping that as a congregation we can continue to improve in this area.

I appreciate your love and support as I continue to grow in Christ.

DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS—David Ledford, chair

The final objective of our Capital Improvement Phase II Project was completed this past year when our workhorse boiler was replaced by two high efficiency boilers. While we are currently going through some minor startup issues with our new heating system, it is a significant improvement over our single boiler that had served the church well for sixty-six years.

Other 2022 significant accomplishments include:

- Sanctuary air conditioner was repaired
- Lower cabinets in the kitchenette were removed and the countertop raised to provide storage space for our serving carts
- Cactus sprayed on the grounds to make it safer for children to play
- Phone system replaced with the financial assistance from the Women's Fellowship Craft Group

We welcome Reva Ortega and Dawn Erk, who have agreed to join in our fun, as we share our love for Christian learning with our UCC children. The department sold grocery cards to fund Church Response and made \$502.50 for Church Response and \$298.50 for the Department of Ministries. Four hundred, forty-nine pounds of food were delivered to Church Response this year and we provided five meals to the Corner Stone Rescue Mission and one meal to Love Inc. The department spoke to the congregation about the four UCC special offerings.

We thank the congregation for their continued support through donations and baking cookies.

The Open and Affirming committee is part of the Department of Ministries and has been meeting as necessary. We participated in the Black Hills Pride event at Memorial Park in July, and displayed the new Pride flag donated by Eileen Rossow. The flag is hanging in Fellowship Hall when not on display at an event. The committee has also invited church members to ask the office for a new name tag that features a rainbow colored UCC logo and can also include the pronouns of choice.

During the year, there were short articles in the bulletins and/or CALL newsletter regarding important dates, or information about specific historic events in the LGBTQ communities.

We celebrated the first anniversary of our certification as an Open and Affirming congregation during the coffee hour on October 30, 2022.

The First Congregational Charitable Trust, Inc. is an independent corporation dedicated to the management of invested funds on behalf of the congregation. Its mission is to solicit and manage financial gifts provided for use in charitable and educational projects beyond the regular operation budget of the church. The funds of the Trust are invested with the United Church Foundation and Charles Schwab.

The Zona White Music Fund provides money to purchase music not in the church budget, unusual instrument maintenance and capital improvements that benefit the music program. The Music Committee determines when expenditures will be made from the fund. In 2022, \$3,619.50 was spent for maintenance work on pianos and the organ.

No college scholarships were given in 2022 because there were no applications or eligible students.

The Power of One Estate Plan encourages members of the congregation to remember the Trust with a gift of 1% of their estates. Donations are welcome now or later as appropriate. To those who have provided for a gift, we extend our gratitude.
