Fire Suppression Project

Request for Proposal - March 26, 2024

The Department of Building and Grounds representing First Congregational Church is requesting cost proposals to provide design and construction services to install fire sprinklers at the First Congregational Church located at 1200 Clark Street, Rapid City, SD. Due to budget constraints, the fire suppression project will most likely need to be implemented in several phases (refer to attached plan). Our main priority is to secure a proposal to have fire sprinklers for Phase 1 installed in the classroom area before start-up of school this August. If our budget allows, we would like to include Phase 2 for the basement area. Due to the unknown timeline for installation of sprinklers for Phases 3, 4 and 5, only the anticipated cost is requested at this time to help with funding raising. 
Fire Suppression Phasing:

Phase 1: Classroom Wings (8,066 SF) Fire protection of the classroom wings and kitchen area is our highest priority. If possible, fire sprinklers need to be installed in this area before school start-up this August, 2024.

Phase 2: Basement (1,450 SF) If the budget allows, our preference would be to include installation of sprinklers in the basement as part of the phase 1 work.

Phase 3: Administrative Office Area (2,470 SF) Installing sprinklers in the administrative office wing is a low priority, but would like to see work done in this area within the next two years.

Phases 4 and 5: Fellowship Hall (2,500 SF) and Church Sanctuary (6,200 SF). This section of the church is a low priority and hope to consider this work in the future. The anticipated cost for this work would be helpful for future fundraising.

News from los Guido, Costa Rica -

Little did we know when we made our first trip to Costa Rica in 2001 that we would be heavily involved with the people in the community of los Guido for the next 2 decades. There have been 4 work teams there (2001, 2003, 2005, 2007) and we have also participated in the Vacation Bible School programming every year since 2002. Trips were not made during the COVID years of 2021, 2022, and 2023.

We remained in close contact with Pastor Dorotea Yucra and so we were not surprised to learn that she had resigned from the board that supervised the Comunidad Cristiana de los Guido 5 when her eldest daughter had a cancer diagnosis that would ultimately end with Sarvia's death on December 15, 2023. It appeared that the sister church relationship that we had enjoyed since 2001 had come to an end. We felt the need for closure so planned a week long trip to bid farewell to many people who had become family.

Even in her intense sorrow, Dorotea opened her home to us for a gathering of her family and friends, all of whom had been deeply involved in the

church. Dorotea's daughter Gady took
the time to drive us around the
neighborhood so we could see as
many old friends as possible in the few
days we were there. It was wonderful
to meet the children of parents whom
we had first known as children
themselves, and to hear stories of
success for those parents raised in a
tough place.

Pastor Dorotea expressed her deep gratitude for all the help received from First Congregational members over the years. Without the help from the Angels of Los Guido fund many children would not have been able to attend school, or go to swim classes, or in some cases even have enough food. The feeding program money had been included in First Congregational's budget for many years, and provided nutritional meals 2 or 3 times a week for the single mothers and their children.


